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The first thing Paul addresses in this text is the condition of our $\qquad$ .

1. To the men...live $\qquad$ lives! (v.8)
(1 Corinthians 11:5; Psalm 24:3-4; John 13:35; Matthew 5:23-24) In this verse, Paul is not referring to postures of prayer, but rather the
$\qquad$ of the one praying!
Our relationships can hinder our $\qquad$ , if we are not loving each other and walking in unity! It will also hinder our $\qquad$ !
2. To the women...live $\qquad$ lives! (v.9-10)
(1 Timothy 5:9-10)
What Paul is saying here is how you are dressing is revealing the condition of your heart - you are trying to put the focus and attention on $\qquad$ and taking it away from who it should be on $\qquad$ !

## God-given roles! (v.11-15)

## Background texts:

Genesis 1:27: From this we see that both men and women are created in the image of God and $\qquad$ valuable to Him!
Genesis 2:18: Eve was created as a helper for Adam. This implies that man and woman $\qquad$ each other.
Ephesians 5:22-24: While men and women are created equally, they are created with different $\qquad$ roles within the marriage relationship. God has given men the primary leadership role within the marriage, but in this role he is to be a $\qquad$ leader loving his wife as Jesus loved the church.

Galatians 3:28: In Jesus, we are equal, no one is any better than anyone else, but we know that God has called us to serve Him in $\qquad$ ways with different gifts.

## The two prohibitions we see in v.11-12:

1. Women are not to teach.
2. Women are not to exercise authority over men.

Paul is prohibiting women from doing the two primary duties that God has assigned to the $\qquad$ who are the spiritual overseers or leaders of the church. Today, we would refer to them as $\qquad$ .
Elders have 2 primary duties:

1. $\qquad$ the church.
2. $\qquad$ - give spiritual instruction. (1 Timothy 3:2; 5:17)

The role of elder is given by God to $\qquad$ ( 1 Timothy 3:2)

What Paul is saying and not saying in v.11-12.
Paul is saying that women should $\qquad$ the leadership and authority of the men God has called to be elders.
Paul is not saying, women have no $\qquad$ and cannot speak!
Paul is not saying every kind of teaching is forbidden to women.
(2 Timothy 1:5; 3:14; Acts 18:26; Matthew 28:19-20; Colossians 3:16; 1 Corinthians 11)
Paul is saying women who are gifted at teaching should $\qquad$ their gifts, just not in the role of an elder, who is the primary preacher/teacher in a public worship gathering.
Paul is not saying that women cannot be in any kind of $\qquad$ in the church.
Paul is saying that they must be under the authority and leadership of the
$\qquad$ of the church as all in the church must be.

While men and women are created equally in the sight of God, God has given them different roles within the $\qquad$ and the $\qquad$ .
