(James 1:13-15)

A) Faithfully support the work of the Temple. (v.4-5; 10)			
Warren Weirsbe in his commentary on this passage said, "When			
God's people start to decline spiritually, one of the first places it shows			
up is in their giving." (Matthew 6:21)			
B) Keep the Sabbath. (v.15-16)			
The Sabbath was to be a day of rest. A day to cease your normal			
activities to focus on God.			
C) Not marry unbelievers. (v.23-24; 28)			
One of the enemy's oldest tactics is getting people away from God's			
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2. Nehemiah the people about their sin.			
In all three cases we see Nehemiah confront the people about their			
sin and gave them changes to make to get back on			
the right track!			
Nehemiah challenged the people to			
A) Faithfully support the work of the Temple. (v.8-9; 11-14)			
Nehemiah the people too much to remain silent!			
(Matthew 21:12-13)			
B) Keep the Sabbath. (v.15, 17-22)			
Sin must be dealt with! Don't delay!			
(Matthew 5:29-30)			
C) Not marry unbelievers. (v.25-29)			



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So, what can we learn from Chapter 13 ?			
3 primary things we can glean from these events			
1. We need to be for God's mercy and grace!			
God's mercy = God not giving us what we deserve!			
We deserve His punishment, wrath and death!			
God's grace = God giving us what we do deserve!			
This passage reminds us that no matter how much we sin, God never			
gives up on us! He will never us!			
God is continually faithful to us, and we are unfaithful time and time			
again! We will never run of His mercy and grace! (Hebrews 4:16)

holy lives! This is the only way we will ever be able to effectively			
God! (Romans 13:14; Galatians 5:16)
